### About Silver Linings Resource Center

Silver Linings Resource Center is designed to help connect older adults, 55 years of age and older with key services who reside in Middlesex County East.

The five core services Silver Linings will focus on are transportation, life skills, legal services, healthy living and housing. The senior-family based center, is where any resident of Middlesex County East can go for senior service support and information services, with life skills at its center.

Services:	Description:
<b>Transportation:</b>	Provide reliable and safe transportation to various key places.
<b>Life Skills:</b>	Provide workshops to navigate the complexities of life. Toiletry assistance for those who meet the income qualifications.
<b>Legal Services:</b>	Provide workshops geared towards legal issues seniors encounter. One on One assistance for those who meet the income qualifications.
<b>Healthy Living:</b>	Provide workshops for fitness, mental health and nutrition. Food Card assistance for those who meet the income qualifications.
<b>Housing:</b>	Provide security deposit for seniors that meet the income qualifications

## Advocacy

In representing the interest of seniors and in working with other agencies and systems, staff will address the broad issues of the development and delivery of quality services, policies and funding.



They may advocate on behalf of individuals who need special support and reinforce the individual's capacity for self-reliance and self-determination through education, affirmation, collaborative planning and problem solving.
